#### Administrative/Biographical History:

Howard Burkher (b. 1901 – d. 1985) married Pauline Virginia Chastain (b. 1905 – d. 2005) on September 7, 1924. That same day, the couple left their home state of Indiana for Alaska.

Through the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Howard and Pauline taught in Unalakleet, Mary's Igloo, Quinhagak, Barrow, and Ketchikan. In 1944, they settled in Anchorage where Pauline helped establish a school in the Alaska Native Medical Hospital. In 1975, the couple was chosen by Pioneers of Alaska, Igloo 15 and Auxiliary 4, as King and Queen Regents of the Anchorage Fur Rendezvous. After retirement, the Burkher's served as active members of the Cook Inlet Historical Society.

The Cook Inlet Historical Society (CIHS) is a private, non-profit historical society founded in 1955 to foster discussion, research, and publication of the history and ethnography of the Anchorage and Cook Inlet regions of Alaska. CIHS was the principal organization responsible for the establishment of the Anchorage Museum in 1968 and its collections formed the core of the Museum collections.

# Scope and Content Description:

This collection consists of seven photographic prints, two table cards, one program with menu, one poster, and one pamphlet. Photos depict Cook Inlet Historical Society activities, including a field trip to Knik Arm and society members with CIHS collections in the newly built Anchorage Historical and Fine Arts Museum. Ephemeral materials are from the 1970 City of Anchorage Golden Anniversary celebration.

Arrangement: This collection was arranged upon accession. This description reflects that arrangement.
