.1 – Chief Kadishan – Wrangell – in front of totem pole [Chief Kadashaan John Katishan posed in regalia, including clan hat, naaxein (Chilkat robe), apron, and holding a carved cane. The

cane was repatriated from the Oakland Museum of California on behalf of Kaachxan.áak'w (Wrangell). The cane was gifted to the Khaasx'agweidí clan around 1850 from their kin of the Haida Staasdaas clan. The cedar cane was masterfully carved by Git'aalhjuu Albert Edward Edenshaw (1810-1894)¹. Photographer possibly identified as Edward DeGroff]

.2 – Three Siwash [individuals] of Fort Wrangle taken by Mr. Beasley of Chicago [three Indigenous individuals, possibly Lingít, posed in western dress. Kaachxan.áak'w (Wrangell)]
.3 – Fort Wrangle. Alaska, U.S. Partridge Photo, 69 Morrison St., Portland, Oregon. Back, Totem poles in front of Chief Shakes house at Fort Wrangle, Alaska, U.S.A. [two carved poles in front of hít. Kaachxan.áak'w (Wrangell), Shtax'héen Kwáan]
