Administrative/Biographical History:

Dora Keen was born on June 24, 1871, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. She was the daughter of surgeon William Williams Keen and Emma Corinna Borden. Keen was educated at Bryn Mawr College, graduating in 1896 with a degree in history.^[1] Her interest in mountaineering began during a trip to the Alps in 1909-1910.

In 1911, Keen traveled to Alaska "merely to see the wonderful scenery of the southwest coast,"^[2] but shortly after arriving developed her plan to summit Mount Blackburn, the highest peak in the Wrangell Mountains, with four gold-miners—Charlie McGonagall, Pete Anderson, Billy Taylor, and Tom Lloyd. Her first attempt failed; however, she returned a year later with a climbing party that included George William Handy. This second attempt took over a month,

but Keen successfully summited on May 19, 1912, along with Handy, completing the first recorded ascent of the mountain. Her 1911 expedition to K'ats'i Tl'aadi (Mount Blackburn) was the first expedition to use dogs on a mountain, the first to succeed without Swiss guides, the first to camp in snow caves, and the first to make a prolonged night ascent.^[3]

Keen married German-born George William Handy on July 8, 1916, in McCarthy, Alaska, in view of K'ats'i Tl'aadi (Mount Blackburn). The two settled on a farm in West Hartford, Vermont, and operated a farm. The couple eventually divorced after sixteen years of marriage. Keen later served as a librarian at the West Hartford Library and sold insurance but continued to travel throughout her later years. In 1962, at the age of 91, Dora Keen went on her final tour of the world, stopping first in Alaska. She died in Hong Kong in 1963.^[4]

In 1956, Lawrence Nielson named the Door Keen Range in the Chugach after Keen to commemorate her climbing achievements.^[5]

Scope and Content Description:

The collection consists of 6 albums with 755 photographic prints and other ephemera created or collected by Dora Keen, circa 1911-1914. This includes photographs taken by Kenn, as well as those taken by other members of her Alaska expeditions, other explorers and geologists working in Alaska, and professional photographers in America and overseas.

Arrangement:

Original order maintained as the scrapbook albums are numbered and labeled. Loose prints are numbered sequentially by album.
