Oscar C. Nielsen was born in Copenhagen Denmark on May 15, 1881. According to census records for Anchorage in 1940, Nielsen was a blacksmith for the Alaska Railroad and his wife Kitty was also originally from Denmark. He likely died in Solvang, California in December 1966.

# Scope and Content Description:

This collection consists of photographs of the Nielsen home and friends and Anchorage scenes. Subjects included in the collection are the 1916 Alaska Labor Union Socialists and Pioneers, a dog sled with a gasoline engine, George Ahgupuk, Oscar Nielsen, Sunbeam Homestead, and Second and Fourth Avenue of Anchorage. Photographers of the collection include McGuin and the Strye Photo shop. Please see photo list for specific photograph information.
