The Miss Alaska USA competition is the pageant that selects the representative for the state Alaska in the Miss USA pageant. Alaska's highest placement was in 1964, with Patricia Marlin as the second runner up. At least three other major races were held in Fairbanks between 1927 and 1941. The Sweepstakes trophy competition began in 1936, consisting of three 30-mile heats. In 1940 and 1941, that race became a mid-distance classic of some 165 miles round trip between Fairbanks and Livengood. Between 1927 and 1934, the Fromm trophy was presented to the winner of the women's sled dog championship, which ran over a distance of about 17 miles.
