Administrative/Biographical History:

Anna Regina Alles was born on a farm in St. Jacobs, Ontario, Canada on March 2, 1866 to Catherine Litt and Peter Alles. Regina was one of fifteen children, including three sets of twins. Her mother died when she was 10 years old and she lived with several family members, including her brother Ezra Alles in Detroit, Michigan as a young woman. She married Fred Baumbach in 1889 and lived in Grand Rapids, Michigan. She gave birth to a child who died and about two years later her husband died.

A few years later, Regina married Elisha D. Burr on April 19, 1894 and they moved to Cincinnati, Ohio. In 1898, the couple went to Alaska near the end of the Klondike Gold Rush (1896-1899) gold rush. They made their way to Dawson City from Valdez, and Regina is credited with being the first white woman to go over Mantasta Pass into Dawson. The couple stayed in Alaska for about 3 years and Regina kept a diary of her experiences during that time, and some of her experiences were shared in local newspapers back home such as the *Detroit Free Press*. Upon their return to the Lower-48 around 1904, the couple moved to California and divorced.

Regina married Perley Frank Linton on July 8, 1910 in San Francisco and they settled in Alhambra, California. In 1949, they moved into a small house behind George and Harriett Linton, Frank's son and daughter-in-law, in Compton, California. Regina died March 20, 1952 and is buried in Rose Hills Cemetery in Whittier, California.

This collection includes one diary written by Anna Regina Alles Burr from March 15, 1898 to February 22, 1904, two transcribed copies, a photo, and newspaper clippings.
